Returning to the Sanctuary: April 18, 2021

Dear Friends,

Yes, it is exciting. We are getting ready to return to worship in our sanctuary. It has been a long season of waiting and preparation to reach this point. That being said, we want to share all the information that pertains to our reopening.

First of all, we want to reassure everyone that there will still be many ways to worship. We know that not everyone is comfortable with being back in the church.

- We will be livestreaming the worship service on our website and you will be able to watch that video at a later time if you would like on youtube.
- and now there will be worship in the sanctuary at the regular time on Sunday mornings at 10:00AM.

The online reservation system will open at noon on Monday and will close at noon on Thursday so be sure to reserve in that window of time if you would rather reserve online. You may also make a reservation for worship over

the phone but that also must be done by Thursday at noon.

In regard to worship in the sanctuary, there will be some differences. Yes, we are returning to the sanctuary, but we will not be returning to everything being exactly the same as before.



As you enter the sanctuary, you will notice that things are a bit different and that is why we have included pictures so you can get a peek before you come.

There are two new children's areas at the back of the sanctuary. We put these in so that Trinity Learning Center could have an additional space to use during the week. We will also use these for in person worship during COVID so that parents of preschool aged and younger children have a safe place to worship with their small children.





You will not find hymnals or Bibles in the pews as they needed to be removed. The service will be printed in your bulletins as usual. We encourage everyone to take their bulletins and announcements home or deposit in the trash on the way out.

You will also find your bulletin at your seat when you come in along with your name. Identifying where everyone is sitting is important for contact tracing should anyone in the congregation become ill with COVID.





Collection plates will be located at the entrance to the sanctuary so you can give your offering as you enter. There will be no singing at this time, but we will have special music provided by soloists. The service itself will be shorter than normal.

The choir will not be singing during COVID so we have transformed our choir area to accommodate a soloist. There will be no group singing in worship and there will not be the regular hymns.



As far as access to the building areas, we are asking that everyone stay in the sanctuary area and use the bathrooms in the main hallway as every area we walk around then has to be sanitized after we leave due to our preschool. Visiting needs to happen outside in the parking lot and in the church.

All the guidelines that we will all need to follow are included here. **Please read them very carefully.** Anyone wishing to return to church in the sanctuary needs to have read and signed and returned a copy to the church office. We are all sad that we need to have guidelines like this in place, but for now they are necessary, until the virus is no longer an issue. The spiritual formation committee met with Pastor Baer and came up with these initial guidelines which then went to session for input and approval. As we begin worship and see how things are going, modifications may be made.

Volunteers Needed:

In order to have sanctuary worship, we need to have a few strategic volunteers every Sunday.

- Congregants checked in upon arrival, (One volunteer per week)
- The sanctuary and bathrooms must be sanitized after every service.
 (Two volunteers per week)

Right now we only have two volunteers to help out with these tasks. Without this help, we will not be able to continue with sanctuary worship. If you can help with any of these tasks, please call the office and indicate what tasks you can help with and on which days.
