How much is enough? This was a very important question for me to answer when I stepped into the director's position at TLC earlier this year. For me, I walked into a role where we had "enough" for years, and we needed the same things annually to prepare for a new school year. Refilling the same supplies, we have ordered in the past, because that was the way that it was done. Our past director was always assured that we had "enough" in the bank as long as there was \$100,000 in the account. We had "enough" supplies for the teachers as long as they had what they needed in their classroom, for their class, when they needed it. There wasn't a number assigned to how much "enough" costs or how much "enough" we will ultimately have, or even how much "enough" is left over, or sitting unused in our storage space. Even though we had "enough" for years there was a worry about having enough. Supplies we stored in individual classrooms referenced with specific person's name, instead of "our's" or "the learning center's". So even though we had enough, things felt scarce.



We reorganized and started a resource library to share supplies. In doing so, we grouped like items together and it was eye-opening on the abundance of materials that we had. We have 8 large Rubbermaid totes assorted foam stickers and a large box filled with Pom-Poms. It seems as though every year we just reordered to have "enough" without recognizing the abundance that we had.



Abundance is in the eye of the beholder. Although we have less students this year, we have an abundance of joy in our classrooms that rivals our pom-pom stash.
