

Trinity Presbyterian Church SPECIAL OFFERING FOR HEATING

Dear Members and Friends,

At the annual meeting on January 29, 2023, Karen Perzia, Treasurer, provided an overview of the 2023 budget. As you are aware, we have been confronted with increases in our family expenses. This is also true of the church. During 2022 our heating and electric bills increased by \$6,000.00. This would indicate that our 2023 utility budget projection would cost \$18,000.00. Heating and electricity is the church's largest single operating expense.

Our Property Committee and heating contactor (Newco) inspected all of the heating and air conditioning equipment and ensure us that they are operating at peak efficiency. The next area to examine is usage. One question frequently asked, do we allow the heat to run when the building is empty? We were advised that we should maintain a level heating setting. We shouldn't lower the heat after school too much. It would be more costly to bring the heat back up to standard recommended levels than to maintain a steady level all night. We do lower the heat in the sanctuary after the service on Sunday and turn it up the following Saturday night.

The Session has considered a number of solutions. The first one is a "Special Offering for Heating." This offering is truly a special offering that will be dedicated to the heat and electric bills. The congregation will be kept apprised of the results of this Special Offering.

Please consider giving as generously as you can. For your convenience, we will place special envelopes on the table outside the entrance to the sanctuary. If you place a check in the offering plate, please write in the memo section "Heating Fund." You may also mail your check to the church office.

Thank you for considering this request. We all want to be warm and comfortable when we attend worship services and events at our church. Your "Special Offering" will be greatly appreciated.
