The Faith of the Centurion

7 When Jesus had finished saying all this to the people who were listening, he entered Capernaum. 2 There a centurion's servant, whom his master valued highly, was sick and about to die. 3 The centurion heard of Jesus and sent some elders of the Jews to him, asking him to come and heal his servant. 4 When they came to Jesus, they pleaded earnestly with him, "This man deserves to have you do this, 5 because he loves our nation and has built our synagogue." 6 So Jesus went with them.

He was not far from the house when the centurion sent friends to say to him: "Lord, don't trouble yourself, for I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. **7** That is why I did not even consider myself worthy to come to you. But say the word, and my servant will be healed. **8** For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and that one, 'Come,' and he comes. I say to my servant, 'Do this.' and he does it."

9 When Jesus heard this, he was amazed at him, and turning to the crowd following him, he said, "I tell you, I have not found such great faith even in Israel." **10** Then the men who had been sent returned to the house and found the servant well.





Our next Bible study TBD sometime in June.



The regular meeting of the Session was held on April 23, 2024, at Trinity Presbyterian Church, Dallas, PA. The Rev. Dr. Murray Thompson served as Moderator.

The following items were discussed and acted upon by the Session.

- 1. **BUILDING AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE:** Elder Wayne Williams reported the following:
 - a. The water runoff issue is being addressed by Big Mountain Excavation. A berm has been placed in the run off area to direct the water away from the areas of concern.
 - b. We have a woodchuck problem. The property committee has purchased a trap and Wayne will trap the woodchucks and relocate them.
 - c. The crash bar on the back door is broken and in need of repair. Wayne Williams is addressing the problem.
 - d. The Deacons have reported that they cannot hear the worship service in the narthex. The Property Committee will address the issue.

2. THE FRANK LINDEN HOWORTH AND MARGARET JONES HOWORTH MEMORIAL TRUST Elder Sandy Peoples

- a. This year the investments generated \$19,400 in interest for distribution.
- b. The Trust Committee approved the disbursement for 2024. Trinity received \$8,600 allocated as follows: (1) Pastor education- \$1000.00, (2) Music program \$2,500.00, (3) Building for the Parking lot \$2,600.00 (4) Outreach \$2,500.00.
- 3. <u>MISSION/OUTREACH</u> Ruling Elder Barbara Rinker submitted the following report for information concerning the April 8, 2024 committee meeting.
 - a. SAMARITAN'S PURSE: Samaritan's Purse is ongoing.
 - b. SCHOOL LUNCH: The committee has agreed to support the Dallas and Lake Lehman lunch programs to help children in need. On Thursday, April 11TH, the committee presented a check for \$250.00 each to Jacki Degnan at Dallas and Mike Kostrobala at Lake Lehman.
 - c. MEALS ON WHEELS: On April 4th, Beth Davis and Nancy Thomas delivered 13 meals.
 - d. On May 22ND, TLC will hold Graduation Day. The Mission/Outreach Committee will supply water, juice boxes and donut holes. At 9am, Beth Davis, Michele Rittenhouse and Nancy Thomas will be on hand to help with the refreshments.
 - e. LEMONAIDE ON THE LAWN will again be held at Trinity. Please check the schedule posted on the bulletin board or contact Kathy Stevens.
 - f. FALL FESTIVAL Committee will have a booth at the festival.
 - g. FALL COAT DRIVE: The committee will look into supporting a fall coat drive.
